Thank you once again for the privilege of serving you.



Taxpayer Assistance Program

The Cuyahoga County Treasurer's Office has expanded eligibility for the Taxpayer Assistance Program to property owners aged 67 or older with incomes of \$70,000 or less.

Are you Eligible?

To be eligible for the Taxpayer Assistance Program in 2026 property owners must:

- Be 67 years of age, or older, at the time of application (expanded age requirement for 2026!)
- Have an annual income at or below \$70,000 (Does not include social security)
- Have a certified delinquent balance*
- Be the deeded owner and have primary residence at the property
- Have owned the property for at least 3 years and plan to continue living in the property for the next 3 years
- · Not have received previous funding through the CHN Taxpayer Assistance Program

What you can receive

Qualifying residents can receive up to \$10,000 in a one-time financial assist which must be used for:

- Payment of certified delinquent property taxes
- · Payment of late property taxes
- · Payment of current property taxes
- Payment of foreclosure fees and court costs related to a pre-existing foreclosure
- Satisfaction of pre-existing tax lien certificates

Department of Aging

2025 Chore Services Program

The purpose of this program is to assist older adults and adults with disabilities that need help maintaining their properties.

Qualifications:

- Must be at least 60 years of age or under 60 and receiving disability.
- Do not reside with an able-bodied individual capable of assisting with the service.
- The house may be a single or two family dwelling. Multi-family homes do not qualify.
- Home must be owner occupied and located within the City of Cleveland *Non homeowners and apartment residents may receive indoor chore services.

- Leaf Raking
- Snow Shoveling
- Indoor Chores

Lower Your Energy Costs by Comparing Gas Providers

If you've noticed your natural gas prices increasing—as I have—it may be time to comparison shop.

Ohio offers an Apples-to-Apples tool through the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio (PUCO) to help residents compare both natural gas and electric suppliers

When reviewing options, remember that your bill includes two types of charges:

- SCO Rate This rate is fixed.
- MRR Rate This is the rate that prompted me to look for a new supplier. It varies and can significantly affect your total cost.

You can compare the price per Mcf across suppliers to find a lower rate. Just be sure to check whether a plan includes:

- A fixed rate for a set period (and whether there's a fee for switching before the term ends).
- A variable rate, which can increase or decrease each month.

Rates can change quickly, so even if you're not switching now, it's worth checking regularly. If rates drop significantly, you may be able to lock in a lower rate for 12 to 36 months.

Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP)

The Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP) is a federally funded program that provides eligible Ohioans assistance with their home energy bills. This one-time benefit is applied directly to the customer's utility bill or bulk fuel bill.

Am I Eligible for HEAP?

Ohioans with a household size of eight or less, and income at or below 175 percent of the federal poverty guidelines, are eligible for the program.




