Did You Know?

How Street Resurfacing Really Works in Cleveland

Each year, Cleveland City **Council Members** receive about \$850,000 to resurface streets in their wards. While it may sound like a lot, resurfacing costs add up quickly! Our office prioritizes streets **based** on their condition grade (A–F), upcoming utility or construction projects, traffic volume, and potential development impacts.

We often combine funds from other city sources and grants to stretch the budget further. For example, Wade Park Avenue is scheduled for resurfacing through a special grant in 2027.

Stakeholder Meeting October 2025 Recap

Councilwoman Howse- Jones hosts **three to four Stakeholder Meetings each year** to bring together community organizations, nonprofits, religious institutions, local businesses, and other partners. These gatherings create space to share updates, discuss community priorities, and explore how we can collectively strengthen the ward.

At our year end meeting in October, we focused on the importance of Mutual Aid — neighbors helping neighbors, sharing resources, and using our existing strengths to meet community needs. Together, we discussed how collaboration can lift one another up, build stronger connections, and ensure every neighborhood has the opportunity to grow and thrive.

Don't Forget Cleveland 311

Remember to utilize the City of Cleveland's Citizen Support Hotline, 311! This line can be used for a variety of **non-emergency local concerns**, including trash pick-up, tall grass, tree damage on city property, open abandoned buildings, potholes, and many other issues. When you dial 311, a support specialist will record your information and send it to the appropriate department, as well as providing you with a reference number that you can check on the status of your request with.

If the city hasn't resolved your issue in excepted time given please feel free to reach out to our office with your reference number, so that we can follow-up on your case.




