Hello, Residents of Ward 14!

I hope you are having a nice summer.

The recently renovated Clark Recreation Center is open for business! The new facility has spaces for classes, a newly finished basketball court, and the pool is ready to go. Recently, Branch Manager Nichole Collins shared that she is most excited about the new indoor/outdoor pool deck. Once complete, families will be able to sit outside on the pool deck to dry off during rest periods. There are still parts of the center that are under construction and won't be finished until late this Fall, including the splash pad and the fenced-in playground. Book a room, take a swim, or play a game at the small but mighty Clark Recreation Center!

This year's **Lincoln West High School Class of 2026** was the final graduating class from its current building, and the seniors chose to hold their graduation ceremony in the school's gymnasium to honor the building's history.

Lincoln West's long-awaited rebuild has begun. The new school will include a 600-seat auditorium with a separate entrance so the community can use the space. The second floor will house nursing and science labs.

The projected timeline calls for the new Lincoln West to open in 2030. Environmental abatement and demolition are expected to take one year, followed by a two-year rebuilding process. The new building is long overdue and will be a wonderful addition to the community.

HOUSING UPDATES & RESOURCES IN WARD 14

Habitat for Humanity & the Landbank, Legacy Communities

At a time when quality, affordable housing can be difficult to find and housing prices continue to rise, we are committed to creating new pathways to homeownership for Ward 14 families by working proactively to create new opportunities and preserve existing housing throughout Ward 14.

On June 20, 2026, Habitat for Humanity, the Cuyahoga Land Bank, and Councilwoman Jasmin Santana celebrated the completion of **four new Legacy Community Homes in the Clark-Fulton neighborhood** alongside the wonderful families who now call these houses home. These innovative modular buildings are part of Cleveland's off-site construction pilot program, demonstrating new ways to build quality, affordable housing more efficiently.

Our work doesn't stop there, though.

Construction is underway on two new homes on W. 18th Street, along with the **renovation of a home at 4211 Sackett Avenue**. These projects are expected to be completed later this year.

Looking ahead, the Cuyahoga Land Bank is acquiring seven additional homes for renovation and also advancing plans for new construction. Altogether, these efforts will result in 16 new or renovated homes throughout Ward 14. Once completed, these homes will be offered for sale to qualified homebuyers to help working families achieve homeownership at an attainable price point. The Land Bank is also available to answer questions and provide information about how interested buyers can apply for these homes. Every new home built and every existing home restored strengthens our neighborhoods, expands homeownership opportunities, and helps ensure Ward 14 remains a place where families can build their future for generations to come.

PROGRAMS TO HELP HOMEOWNERS:

Great Estates, New Free County Program

In May, Cuyahoga County Employees attended a Ward 14 and Metro West Community Meet-up to share The Great Estates Program with residents. **The program is to help residents avoid unnecessary costs and delays when settling an estate of a loved one who has passed away.** The program permits the direct transfer of real property (Homes) to the designated beneficiary or beneficiaries upon the death of the owner, thereby avoiding Probate administration. ReStockyard Home Repair

A 2023 Fair Housing Center study found a decline in owner-occupied homes across Cleveland's west side, especially in Ward 14. In Stockyards, the number dropped from 2,178 in 2000 to 1,416 in 2020.

The study also found that **only 19% of homeowners in Stockyards who applied for repair loans were approved**, and few received the full amount requested.

Our Council office knows there is a great need for home repair resources for owner-occupied homes. Homeowners needing assistance may qualify for the ReStockyard Home Repair Program, the Heritage Home Program or the Hebrew Free Loan Association.

HOUSING UPDATE

Ward 14 and Building & Housing Take Action

Working together to hold negligent property owners accountable

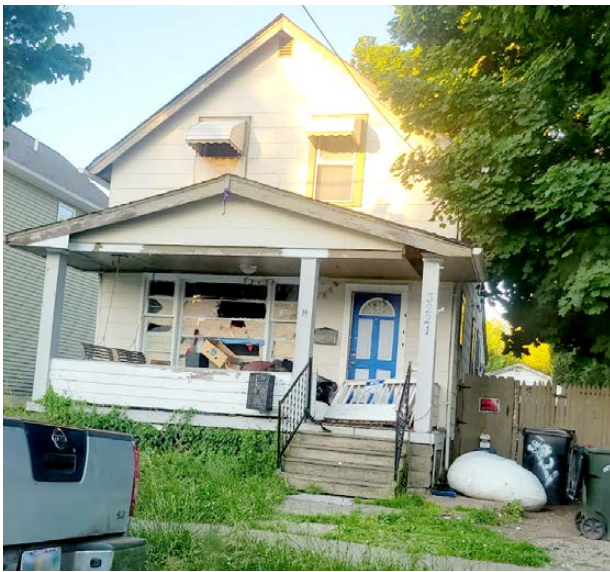


My team and I have spent countless hours driving through Ward 14, documenting some of our community's most neglected vacant properties. Many of these homes have already been reported to Building & Housing and have received citations, but too many continue to sit vacant and deteriorate.

To better understand the scope of the problem, Director Martin from Building & Housing joined us for a tour of some of the most challenging areas in the Stockyards and Brooklyn Centre neighborhoods. Together, we reviewed long-standing resident concerns submitted through 311 and identified 44 properties that require immediate attention due to their condition.

Working alongside Building & Housing, Street Maintenance, the Illegal Dumping Division, and the Cleveland Department of Public Health, we committed to holding absentee property owners and out-of-state LLCs accountable for properties they have allowed to fall into disrepair. Too many of these structures have become magnets for illegal dumping, squatting, criminal activity, and neighborhood blight, creating real safety concerns and diminishing the quality of life for nearby residents.

During our meeting with the Street Maintenance team, we also learned about the City's growing partnership with Cuyahoga County to expand the use of trail cameras at chronic illegal dumping locations. One of the most common sources of illegal dumping continues to be residential clean-outs, where contractors hired to empty homes illegally dispose of furniture, construction debris, and



household trash in vacant lots and alleyways instead of using approved disposal sites. Mr. John Campbell reported that **Ward 14 received 110 illegal dumping service requests between 2025 and 2026 alone.**

Addressing vacant, neglected, and nuisance properties remains one of my highest priorities. We understand the burden these properties place on our neighborhoods, and we will continue pushing for stronger enforcement, greater accountability, and long-term solutions that protect our residents.

Thank you to every resident who continues to report issues, submit requests to 311, and advocate for our community. Your involvement makes a difference. Together, we can preserve the neighborhoods that generations of families have invested in while creating a cleaner, safer, and stronger Ward 14 for everyone.

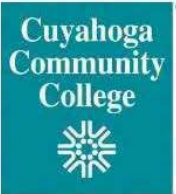
